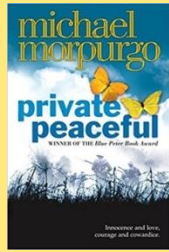


# Our Lady of Walsingham Catholic Primary School - Curriculum Overview for Autumn Term 2020:

### History

  - Can they say where WW1 fits on a timeline?
  - Can they place events from WW1 on a timeline?
  - Can they summarise the main events from WW1, explaining the order in which key events happened?
  - Can they describe features of WW1 events and people from past societies and periods they have studied?
  - Can they look at two different versions of cause of WW1 and say how the author may be attempting to persuade or give a specific viewpoint?
  - Can they identify and explain their understanding of propaganda?
