English

Reading

To read selection of books about the Stone Age from class library.

To be able to explore, ask and answer questions about a range of texts using the Stone Age resources.

To listen to and discuss a range of stories from list above.

To use a dictionary to find and check the meaning of words. (words chosen from Stig of the Dump)

Stone Age Boy/Stig from Dump/Ug

Writing

To predict the story from cover (Stone Age Boy)(setting, characters)

To use ambitious word choices to describe image from text.

To use openers to improve sentences.

To use speech bubbles - using inverted commas for speech in text.

In sentences use prepositions when describing inside a cave.

To ideas from own reading and modelled examples to write a blurb for book for an audience. To write in paragraphs.

Grammar

Maintain the correct tense. Use FS, CL, QM, EM

Inverted commas for direct speech

Subordinate clauses

Conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to show time, place and cause. Use 'a' or 'an' correctly

Spelling

Learn to spell and use words from statutory year 3 list. Using spelling shed practise using these.

Spell and learn words related to Year 3 Topic work.

Art & Design

To study at examples of stone age cave paintings and why they were drawn.(IT) Chauvet Cave – France etc.

Use sketch books to create a template (hands, animals, spears etc.)

Copy these images into large cave. (Paints/chalk)

Make large round house using natural materials (stones and sticks)

Design & Technology

Using the internet - look at images of designs of prehistoric pots and beakers. (shape and markings)

Manipulate clay and create a pot or beaker using appropriate techniques (sticks)

Look at Bronze Age and Iron Age jewellery

Design and make a (torc) from gold and silver paper. Salt dough beads
